The service and accomplishments of Dooley and Nunn embody "the highest ideals of the original trustees and merit inclusion in this distinguished group," said W. Todd Groce, president and CEO of the GHS.

The original trustees were appointed by King George II in 1732 to govern the colony. The title was revived in 2009 as an honorary appellation, and represents an annual opportunity to celebrate the contributions of contemporary Georgians.

Dooley and Nunn, like those earlier trustees who served the king, "exuded selflessness, leadership and honor" in their long and distinguished careers, said Groce.

For Dooley, who led UGA to the 1980 national championship and posted more than 200 victories during his coaching career, being named a trustee struck a deep chord. A longtime history buff, he donated his papers to the society in 2007, and is currently one of its curators.

The designation "humbled" him and came as "a huge surprise," said Dooley, who earned a master's degree in history from Auburn University in 1963.

Groce, however, said "no one" is more deserving of the title than Dooley, who took his football program to the top, and also "inspired and prepared for leadership and service several generations of young men who themselves have had a tremendous impact on Georgia."

Billy Payne, Frank Ros, Ray Goff, Herschel Walker and Buck Belue, "just to name a few," have gone on to distinguished careers, and form an important part of Dooley's legacy as a teacher and mentor, Groce said.

Like Dooley, Nunn is no stranger to a pressure-packed environment. A native of Perry, Nunn served four terms in the U.S. Senate.

During his 1972-1996 tenure, Nunn earned a reputation as an expert on military affairs. He also helped champion legislation concerning nuclear weapons, and his work in that cause continues today.

"His impact goes far beyond Georgia, and our nation, and is truly international in scope," Groce said. "The world is a better place because of him."

Nunn and Dooley join a distinguished list of modern trustees. The 2009 honorees were Bernie Marcus, a Home Depot co-founder and philanthropist, and the late Marguerite Neel Williams, a founding trustee of The Georgia Trust for Historic Preservation. In 2010, the
