# Annual Report of the Georgia Historical Society for Fiscal Year 2010

## INTRODUCTION

It has been an exciting and successful year for the Georgia Historical Society, one filled with opportunities to preserve and interpret Georgia history in new and powerful ways, but one also filled with challenges as we continued to deal with the on going effects of the economic slump that has plagued our state and nation.

Financially the Society saw a decline in its assets during the previous fiscal year (FY2009), due entirely to losses in our endowment produced by the downturn in the stock market. For the year ending June 30, 2009, total net assets stood at \$7,068,612, a decrease of over 15 percent from the previous year. Despite ongoing contributions, the endowment declined from \$6.54 million to \$5.34 million during the same twelve-month period, a decline of 17.6 percent. The picture for FY2010, however, was much brighter. We ended the fiscal year with a balanced budget and our endowment is steadily climbing back, reaching the \$5.6 million mark by the end of the fourth quarter in June 2010. For the year ending June 30, 2010, total net assets had recovered to \$7,382,181, an increase of 4.2 percent from the previous year.

We worked hard last year to make GHS as effective and efficient as possible. Only 8.7 percent of our expenses were administrative and just 5.8 percent were fund raising. In other words, nearly 86 cents of every dollar donated to us went directly toward our educational programs and publications, archival preservation, and research services.

On Georgia Day, February 12, 2010, we dedicated in the reading room of Hodgson Hall four plaques recognizing the creation of four new named endowment funds: The Jack and Barbara Cay Fund, the Robert Houstoun Demere Fund, the Lee and Emma Adler Fund, and the *Savannah Morning News* Fund. This brings the total of named funds within the Society's endowment to thirty-eight. The donors who created these funds deserve a special thank you for their investment in the future of this institution and its educational mission. They could make no greater gift to the future than to ensure the continuation of Georgia's premier independent statewide institution responsible for collecting, examining, and teaching Georgia and American history.

All this is to say that despite a less-than-ideal economy the Georgia Historical Society's financial position is strong. Innovative fund raising, a compelling message, careful management, reductions in spending, and a strong and loyal base of support have not only brought us safely through the storm thus far but have also positioned us to resume our growth now that the economy is beginning to improve. Our members and supporters continue to make giving to GHS a priority, and for that we're very grateful.

The Society has been good stewards of the money you have contributed and we achieved a number of notable successes this past year even in the midst of an economic crisis not of our making. Space does not permit me to share all of FY2010's remarkable successes but a few stand out as truly noteworthy.

Chief among these is the *Georgia History Festival* (formerly Georgia Days) and the accompanying Trustees Gala. As you know, the GHF is the Society's signature school education program, over two weeks of programming (twenty different programs, to be exact) that bring history alive for young people and help to educate them about Georgia and American history. This past year's historical honoree, Jackie Robinson, generated a lot of excitement among the 20,000 school children who participated in the various programs, including the Georgia Day Parade, the Colonial Faire and Muster, and the classroom visits made by interpreters portraying General Oglethorpe and Jackie Robinson; and the curriculum about the life of Jackie Robinson is now online and available to teachers across the state. The highlight of the event, of course, was the Trustees Gala on February 13, 2010, when U.S. Senator Johnny

Isakson joined us to honor and induct as Georgia Trustees two legendary Georgians whose fame is worldwide, Ted Turner and Hank Aaron.

The Georgia History Festival is also the Society's only fundraising event, and as such its success is critical to the health of this institution. Under the leadership of event chairman and Board member Chris Humes and his committee, the 2010 event grossed \$420,000, of which we cleared nearly \$200,000. These funds were used to support the operation of services not otherwise fully funded, such as the library and archives and the *Georgia Historical Quarterly*. I am also extremely pleased that GHS Board member Bob Jepson agreed to serve as chairman of the 2011 *Georgia History Festival* and set an aggressive goal of \$800,000, which I have no doubt we will achieve.

In August 2009 we were thrilled to receive word that we had been awarded not one but three major federal grants, two from the National Endowment for the Humanities and one from the Institute for Museum and Library Services. These grants are for projects exceeding a total in federal and private matching funds of \$500,000.

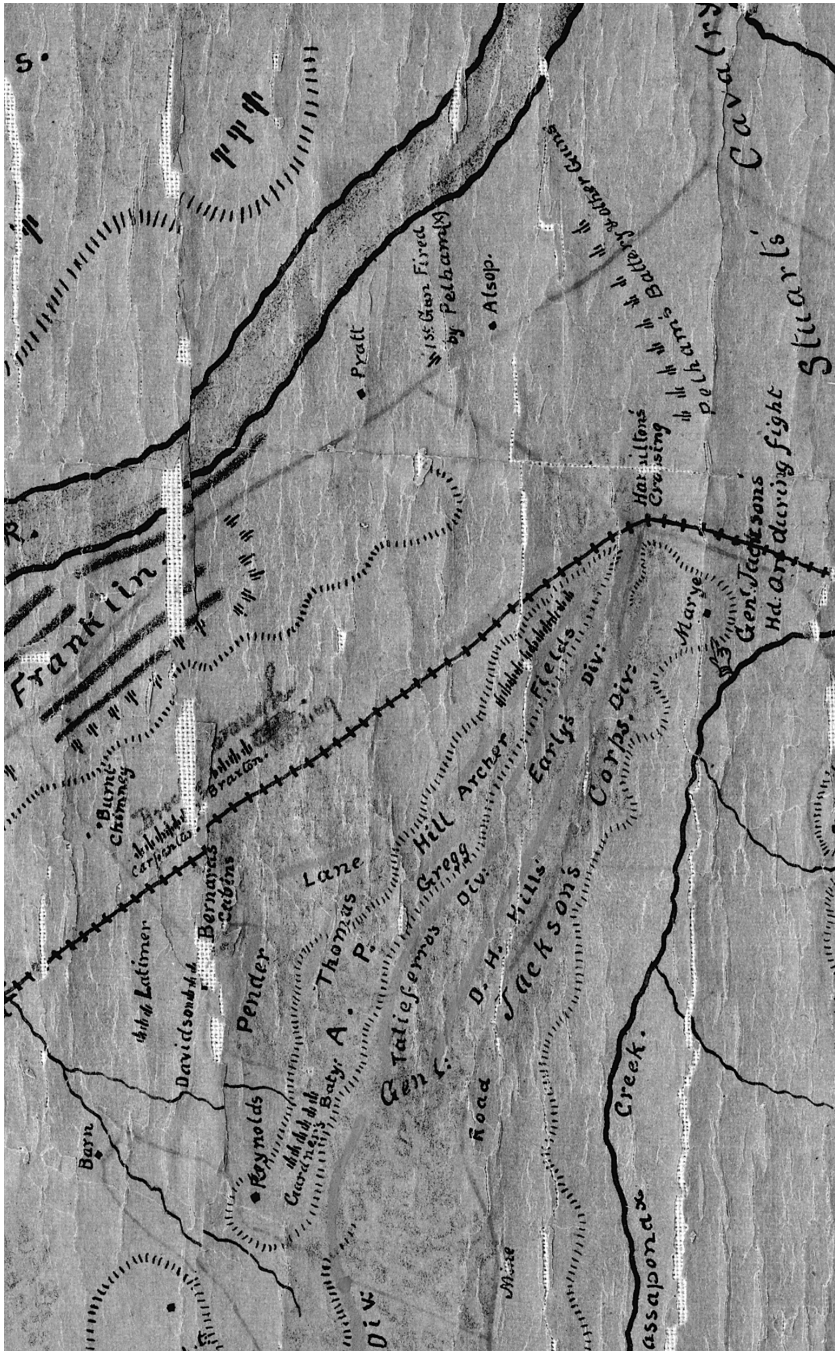


The Georgia History Festival is the Society's signature school education program that annually helps to teach 25,000 students about Georgia history. Thousands of costumed schoolchildren marched in the Georgia Day Parade on February 12, 2010, marking the 277th anniversary of the founding of Georgia.

But these grants represent more than just financial support. They are also recognition on the national level of the extraordinary quality of the programming, services, staff, and archival collections of the Georgia Historical Society. The process for receiving these prestigious national awards is highly competitive. Applications for funding are peer reviewed and awarded to only a small number of institutions.

The IMLS "Museums of America" grant is a two-year project to increase accessibility to history by cataloging our maps, portraits, and artifacts into our online catalog and providing digital images

of the portraits and artifacts on our web site. This is the third phase of what will eventually be a six-year, \$1 million project to increase accessibility to history by opening the collection and creating online resources and tools for researching it. In the process we are laying the ground work for an extensive digitization project, the first phase of which will be launched during the coming year.

The NEH grants are equally exciting. The first, entitled “The American Civil War at 150: New Approaches,” was for training university and college faculty in the latest scholarship on the Civil War as we approach the 150th anniversary of that conflict. Fourteen university and college teachers and two graduate students descended on the Society’s headquarters in June for four weeks of intensive study, lectures by distinguished scholars, readings, and field trips to Civil War sites in the region. The other award was for a related seminar for community college teachers on the history and culture of African Americans in the lowcountry to be implemented in July 2010.

These grants reflect the relevance of GHS, not just to the people of Georgia but to the United States. The sixty-six college faculty representing twenty-six states that participated in these programs this summer returned home and are now using the knowledge and

insights they gained to improve the level and quality of their teaching. By teaching the teachers, the influence of the Georgia Historical Society will be felt around the nation for generations to come. And these are the kind of programs that separate us from other history—and preservation—related institutions, none of which are receiving federal grants to train college faculty in history.

Additional educational offerings during the year ending June 30, 2010, included public lectures on new scholarship, publications, and tours. During the summer of 2009 the GHS staff offered courses on topics such as the Civil War and genealogy and walking tours of Savannah various aspects of the city's history. During the fall of 2009 GHS cosponsored two programs with Armstrong Atlantic State University on the Federal Writers Project of the 1930s and in February 2010 National Public Radio's Scott Simon lectured on his biography of Jackie Robinson, the 2010 Georgia History Festival historical honoree. In March 2010 we joined with the Ossabaw Foundation and the University of Georgia Press in the debut of the new book *African American Life in the Georgia Lowcountry*, which featured a lecture by African-American scholar Emory Campbell and a question and answer session with the book's numerous contributors. The City of Savannah sponsored these lectures as well as the development of an online curriculum for teachers on interpreting the Gullah/Geechee heritage in the twenty-first century. In addition, GHS traveled the state to implement a Georgia Department of Labor-funded series of workshops on developing heritage tourism held in communities across the state during May and June of 2010, including Thomasville, Canton, Savannah, and Augusta.

Another major program during Fiscal Year 2010 that promoted a better understanding of the past was our annual Profiles in Leadership event held on October 15, 2009, in the studio of Georgia Public Broadcasting in Atlanta. The discussion focused on the notorious lynching of Jewish factory manager Leo Frank in 1915 and its legacy in Georgia history. The program was recorded by GPB and broadcast on Georgia Public Television immediately following the national debut of *The People v. Leo Frank*, a new documentary on the Frank Case. This was just one of several collaborations between GPB and GHS that has developed now that we have opened an office in Atlanta located in the GPB building on 14th Street.

One of the speakers at the Profiles in Leadership event was Steve Oney, author of the highly acclaimed book *And the Dead Shall Rise: The Murder of Mary Phagan and the Lynching of Leo Frank*. Steve donated all of his voluminous research on the book to us, creating at GHS what has been described as *the* starting point for any future study of this dark chapter in Georgia's history. Steve's collection joined hundreds of others that were acquired, processed, and cataloged by our archivists. In fact by the end of the fiscal year in June we cataloged and made available for research 1,228 new collections (341 collections of documents, 722 maps, 97 artifacts, and 68 portraits) along with 85 books and rare pamphlets, creating access to over 500 cubic feet of new primary materials with which scholars and researchers will discover new avenues to explore the past.

GHS is not only a place for conducting research but has also been publishing it since 1840, making us the oldest publisher of

Georgia history in the state. The venerable *Georgia Historical Quarterly* completed its 94th year of publication, offering readers in 2010 a veritable potpourri of Georgia history, with articles on topics ranging from Atlanta's environmental history during the late nineteenth century, to Charles Augustus Lamar and the reopening of the slave trade, to the attempt to ban football at the University of Georgia, plus dozens of reviews by distinguished scholars of the latest books on Georgia and American history. All of the back issues of the *GHQ* going back to the first volume in 1917 will soon be available through J-STOR, an online service that provides access to thousands of scholarly journals, thereby extending the reach of this crucial and unique publication dedicated to the scholarly examination of our state's history.

The *GHQ* also gained a new editor. In February 2010 we received word from Dr. Anne Bailey that she would be retiring from her teaching position at Georgia College & State University and stepping down as editor of the *Quarterly* after ten successful years. A search for her successor was launched shortly thereafter resulting in the hiring of Dr. Glenn McNair of Kenyan College in Gambier, Ohio. A native of Savannah, Dr. McNair is eminently qualified to succeed Dr. Bailey as editor. Following a short career in law enforcement as a policeman and federal agent, Dr. McNair shifted gears and decided to become a scholar and teacher. He was educated in Georgia, receiving his B.A. from Savannah State University, his M. A. from Georgia College & State University, and his Ph.D. in history from Emory University. The focus of his research is Georgia history, in particular slavery and the antebellum legal system in the state. Dr. McNair is only the sixth editor of the *GHQ* in nearly a century of publication, the first African-American editor, and the first to reside outside the state of Georgia.

GHS also enhanced the public's ability to explore the past through our ongoing Civil War 150 Historical Marker Project. Developed in conjunction with the Georgia Department of Economic Development, Georgia Battlefields Association, Georgia Department of Labor, and the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, this project will use historical markers to encourage tourism during the upcoming 150th anniversary of the Civil War that begins in January 2011. This past year, GHS completed the survey of all 919 Civil War historical markers in Georgia, which allowed us

to create an online data base so that tourists can easily discover these markers and visit them using the latest in global positioning technology. The survey also allowed us to identify markers needing repair or replacement and what parts of Georgia's story had not been told through the existing historical markers. With this data we began the process of restoring and repairing seven markers along the route of Sherman's March and of creating thirteen new markers about previously neglected subjects, such as the story of African Americans in combat near Dalton, a wartime industrial explosion in Augusta, an attempted slave revolt in South Georgia, a bread riot in Columbus, the burning of Atlanta, the rejected proposal to enlist slaves in the Confederate army, Georgia's secession convention, and the drowning just north of Savannah at Ebenezer Creek of hundreds of freed slaves who were following Sherman's army as it approached Savannah.

By the end of the fiscal year in June we had dedicated at Ebenezer Creek in Effingham County the first of these twenty Civil War-related historical markers. We also designed and launched a micro web site which will allow students, tourists, and history enthusiasts to develop their own custom designed driving tours based on historical markers. Using Google maps, this innovative, one-of-a-kind, state-of-the art site has placed Georgia at the forefront of technology-based resources for developing heritage tourism. The site can be accessed by going to [www.georgiahistory.com](http://www.georgiahistory.com) and clicking on the tab for Historical Markers. Future improvements include a series of smart phone applications that will further strengthen heritage tourism and make history even more accessible.

In addition to the Civil War 150 Historical Marker Project, the GHS Historical Marker Program continued to tell the story of Georgia along the state's highways. Deep cuts in state funding have almost eliminated this important educational and tourism program but private funds raised by GHS manage to keep it alive. During FY2010 four new markers were approved by the GHS review committee and seven new markers were installed in places such as Lowndes County on the Mary Turner Lynching, in Lamar County on President Franklin Roosevelt's 1936 Barnesville speech, in McIntosh County on antebellum planter Thomas Spalding's home Ashantilly, and in Richmond County on the Haines Normal and Industrial Institute.

At the annual meeting in April 2010 we recognized a number of organizations and several individuals for their contributions to Georgia history and to the Georgia Historical Society. Three of the Society's most stalwart supporters were given the Society's highest awards: Don and Kay Kole received the John Macpherson Berrien Award for lifetime achievement and Buddy Sullivan received the Sarah Nichols Pinckney Volunteer of the Year Award for the service he has rendered to GHS as board member and chairman of key committees. A full listing of awards can be found in the report that follows.

The year ahead will be an exciting one. Not only will we complete the Civil War historical marker project, but in June 2010 the Board of Curators approved a plan to launch a \$4 million campaign (since augmented to \$7 million) to build our capacity to sustain and grow the institution by introducing GHS to new audiences and taking full advantage of the office we have opened in Atlanta. Chaired by Board member Phil Jacobs of Atlanta, the campaign will raise funds to use technology to increase access to history and to expand the Society's physical space so that we may continue our efforts to collect Georgia history.

One key aspect of the campaign will be the creation of a new program called "Today in Georgia History." These 90-second spots exploring what happened each day in Georgia history will be produced in partnership with GPB. Broadcast twice a day, seven days a week on radio, television, and the internet, these programs will be available to GPB's millions of viewers and listeners and the 40,000 teachers who annually turn to GPB for teaching content, allowing us to fulfill our mission on an unprecedented scale and enhancing our visibility across the state. Another component of the campaign will be to process on a detailed level the papers of Vince Dooley and Griffin Bell and then digitize significant portions of these important collections so that they will be accessible to the world through the Society's online catalog and web site. And most significantly the campaign will make it possible for us to undertake the first expansion of our campus in 40 years, providing the proper administrative office space and archival storage necessary to take the institution to the next level as we approach our 175th anniversary.

Let me conclude this brief overview of the past year and a peek at the next by thanking the many people without whom we could not have achieved so many successes. Our board is one of the strongest in the state and its commitment, support, and guidance under the dynamic leadership of Chairman Bill Jones, who was reelected in the spring of 2010, has been indispensable. Our remarkable staff, in particular the senior management team led by executive vice president Laura García Culler and composed of Senior Historian Stan Deaton, Library and Archives Director Nora Lewis, Program Director Christy Crisp, and Grants and Special Projects Director Leanda Rix have inspired all of us with their hard work, skill, and dedication. Our many partners across the state, such as Georgia Public Broadcasting, the Georgia Department of Economic Development, Georgia Department of Labor, Georgia College & State University, Georgia Battlefields Association, the Georgia Humanities Council, and Georgia Department of Natural Resource, are to be thanked for joining forces with us to educate our citizens and thereby make Georgia a better place to live. And I also want to thank you, our members, for your support and dedication. Without you there would be no Georgia Historical Society.

We—board, staff, and members—are engaged in one of the most important tasks we can undertake as citizens of this great republic—ensuring that the story of our state and nation continues to be told and preserved. Whether it’s teacher training, seminars for college faculty, the *Georgia Historical Quarterly*, historical markers along the highways, or programs designed specifically for schoolchildren, GHS is dedicated to providing educational opportunities for all Georgians. In doing so we provide a deeper understanding of our country’s history, its unique form of government and economic system, and the sacrifices that have been made to defend and expand our liberties.

The essence of what it means to be an American is contained in the story of our nation. By preserving the record and telling the story of our past, the Georgia Historical Society instructs, inspires, and shapes future generations of Americans, transmitting to them our collective national experience.

Patrick Henry once wrote, “I have but one lamp that guides my feet and that is the lamp of experience.” Your support this year for the Georgia Historical Society has made it possible for us to keep the lamp of experience burning brightly. Thank you.
