

Annual Report of the Georgia Historical Society for the Year 2021

In many ways, the year 202I was really the second chapter in a story that began in 2020. Over the past twelve months, the Georgia Historical Society continued to struggle with many of the same challenges we faced the previous year, all due to the Covid-I9 pandemic: remote working, virtual or postponed public programming, construction delays, supply chain breaks, and unpredictability in nearly every facet of our lives and business.

But there were also similar opportunities and successes: record fundraising, strong team morale, and innovative ways to reach new and expanded audiences. As the old saying goes, necessity is the mother of invention, and the pandemic stretched the limits of our imagination and revealed just how creative we could be when both adversity and opportunity came knocking.

In short, just like the year that preceded it, 2021 was a success for the Georgia Historical Society. The financial health of the institution has never been better, and our reach and visibility have never been greater. With a completely transformed campus, a renovated and expanded Research Center, diversified educational offerings, a growing endowment, and one of the best boards in the state, the institution is well positioned for unprecedented growth in the year ahead.

The following report offers an in-depth look at the programming, services, fund raising, and financial activity of 2021. Here are few of the highlights and milestones that made it a memorable and remarkable year:

- ★ Completion of the \$5 million Research Center expansion and renovation project, along with the capital campaign that funded it
- ★ A successful *Georgia History Festival* that for the second year in a row raised over \$1.6 million for history education and research
- ★ Completion of a \$1 million pledge by John and Marilyn McMullan to fund the Marilyn Memory McMullan Director of Programs, ensuring in perpetuity the delivery of high-quality history-education programming
- ★ Foundational research and expanded educational programming about the history of race made possible by grants totaling nearly \$600,000 from partners including Coca-Cola, Gulfstream, and the Rich Foundation in Atlanta
- ★ The first televised Trustees Gala, broadcast on television stations in Atlanta, Augusta, Columbus, and Savannah
- ★ The induction by Governor Brian Kemp of David Abney and Juanita Baranco as Georgia Trustees
- ★ Record usage of our online educational resources, with nearly half a million page views
- ★ Acquisition of hundreds of letters, documents, photographs, maps, pamphlets, political campaign memorabilia, and artifacts donated by Ed Jackson of Athens, probably the most significant collection, both in terms of size, scope, and research value, of Georgia history materials still in private hands
- ★ Donation by the Atlanta Journal-Constitution of portraits, documents, and its entire newspaper microfilm collection going back to the 1860s
- * A strong financial position, with growth of more than 17 percent in the institution's assets

While we were busy pursuing these goals, the ongoing work of the Georgia Historical Society continued unabated, despite the many Covid 19-related obstacles that stood in our way. We repaired, replaced, and erected dozens of historical markers, ensuring that Georgians and visitors alike would continue to learn about our state's past. We published four issues of the award-winning *Georgia Historical Quarterly*, making accessible to the public cutting-edge historical scholarship. The *Business History Initiative* used historical markers and case studies to share with adults and school children the stories of iconic Georgia companies like Synovus and the Colonial Group. We held multiple teacher-training seminars, enhancing classroom instruction and providing teachers with the tools they need to teach difficult but necessary history.

Throughout the year, GHS served as a trusted resource, and not just for academics, scholars, and teachers. Leaders in the fields of business, politics, and journalism turned to GHS for perspective and historical context on issues ranging from Confederate monuments and race relations to domestic terrorism and the future of democracy. GHS historians and educators delivered presentations, both live and virtual, at professional meetings, Chamber of Commerce conferences,





leadership seminars, and civic clubs across the state and beyond. The appointment in 2021 of GHS Senior Historian Stan Deaton as a Distinguished Lecturer of the Organization of American Historians reflects the growing national reputation and influence of our institution.

As a reminder of lingering resistance to new interpretations about the past, we received word last spring that three of our historical markers had been vandalized. All were heavily damaged by gunfire (both shotgun and rifle rounds) and all were about African-American history. Rarely are historical markers vandalized; of the few that have been, only these three have been shot. The GHS Board of Curators stepped forward to underwrite the recasting and reinstallation of the Mary Turner Lynching marker in Lowndes County, which was rededicated in December. A replacement Jackie Robinson Birthplace marker in Grady County, along with an additional one in the county seat of Cairo, was installed and Major League Baseball generously donated \$25,000 to create an endowment fund, named in memory of the great baseball player, to provide perpetual maintenance for markers. Both Jackie Robinson markers are scheduled for rededication in January 2022.

This report would not be complete without noting that in 2021 the Georgia Historical Society lost one of its best friends with the untimely death of Vice Chairman Pete Correll. The former CEO of Georgia Pacific and a 2017 Georgia Trustee inductee, Pete was preparing to assume the role of board chairman when he died in May after a short illness. He was a generous and dynamic leader who leaves behind a legacy of service. His keen intellect and wonderful sense of humor will be sorely missed. To succeed him as vice chairman, former Lockhead Martin general manager and Atlanta Committee for Progress CEO Shan Cooper was elected in August, setting the stage for our institution's first African-American woman as chairman.

The accomplishments of 2021 were the product of innovative, skillful, and often courageous leadership at both the board and staff levels. The Board of Curators, led by Chairman Tommy Holder, was always supportive and inspirational; the Endowment Trust, chaired by John McMullan, never produced better results. The GHS staff was simply amazing. Laura García-Culler, Christy Crisp, Stan Deaton, and Beth Robinson deserve special mention for their efforts. I cannot say enough about these hard-working, talented professionals who always make me look better than I am.







Educational Outreach


Our online, remote, and in-person resources for teachers and students contain relevant historical content, educational videos, primary sources, tips for classroom instruction, fully-developed lesson plans, and resource guides aligned to state performance standards.

Georgia History Festival

Georgia History Festival 2020-2021: "Tear Down This Wall: Georgia in Cold War America"

New Educational Resource: During the reporting period, GHS published the 2021 edition of Newspapers in Education, Media and the Cold War, as well as an additional classroom resource, Media Literacy Classroom Activity Guide.

Teacher Webinars: Responding to the need for online instruction and support, the winter

2021 webinar focused on showing educators how-to strategies for using the new *Georgia History Festival* materials in classrooms and participating in Georgia Day 2021.

Georgia Day Parade: Despite the COVID-19 pandemic requiring an alternative to the traditional parade during the reporting period, Georgia students had the opportunity to participate in Georgia Day 2021 through an exploration of the online parade theme, "Georgia Leaders on the World Stage," supporting the Cold War focus of the 2020-2021 Festival. A Georgia Day Parade Online Program was presented virtually on Georgia Day, Friday, February 12, 2021. GHS staff members worked with WSAV-TV to produce this online program for the 2021 Georgia Day Parade.

In lieu of the annual parade-banner competition, GHS hosted virtual competitions for Georgia Day 2021. In addition to the popular **classroom banner competition**, GHS held an **art contest** for individual students based on the online parade theme, "Georgia Leaders on the World Stage." Students and teachers from across Georgia submitted banners and artwork that explored Georgia leaders with national political and social impact from the beginning of Georgia history through the late twentieth century. GHS staff members organized, promoted, and managed the online banner and art competitions.

Super Museum Sunday: The Georgia Historical Society's Georgia History Festival "Super Museum Sunday" took place on Sunday, May 2, 2021, when more than sixty historic sites, house museums, art museums, and other points of interest throughout Georgia opened their doors to the public—free of charge—offering a variety of in-person and virtual experiences for thousands of attendees during the extraordinary circumstances of the global pandemic.

Georgia History Festival 2021-2022 "From Marshes to Mountains, Georgia's Changing Landscape: Geography, History, and Community."

The 2021-2022 focus of study is "From Marshes to Mountains, Georgia's Changing Landscape: Geography, History, and Community." New classroom materials explore how land and our relationship to it have been crucial factors in creating social, cultural, economic, and political systems over time. A new historical inquiry kit highlights the most significant events, people, and factors that influenced westward expansion in Georgia during the period 1789-1840. Additional resources and activities explore ways Georgians are impacted by the geographic context of where they live and how they, in turn, impact the physical space and environment around them.

New Classroom Resources: GHS education staff published new GHF education resources and programming exploring the 2021-22 theme, "From Marshes to Mountains, Georgia's Changing Landscape: Geography, History, and Community." New resources include "Georgia's Westward Expansion" Inquiry Kit. The Inquiry Kit contains primary source activities for students. Other new classroom resources include "Georgia's People and Places Teacher Guide" and "People and Places: A Visual Literacy Activity Guide" accompanying classroom activities supporting the annual Georgia Day Parade Banner Competition and Statewide Art Contest. A draft of the 2022 Newspapers in Education titled "Analyzing Maps and Using Geographic Thinking Skills" was developed to be published in early 2022.

Teacher Webinars: New educational programing was presented including preparing for a series of three Teacher Webinars featuring collaborations with the Coastal Georgia Historical Society and the High Museum of Art, as well as three in-school programs for students partnering with Massie Heritage Center.

• Using the Georgia's Westward Expansion Inquiry Kit in the Classroom (for K-12 educators): GHS hosts a one-hour informational webinar featuring the new "Georgia's Westward Expansion" student inquiry kit.

- "Hometown Stories on the National Stage: Using Local Resources to Teach U.S. History" (for K-12 educators and Affiliate Chapter members): GHS and the Coastal Georgia Historical Society (CGHS) explored how historical institutions bring local history to life for students, teachers, and the public.
- Georgia Day Statewide Art Contest: Theme, Resources, and Teaching Strategies (for K-12 educators): GHS education staff and the teaching and learning specialist from High Museum of Art hosted a one-hour informational webinar for teachers interested in teaching visual literacy to support participation in the Georgia Day Statewide Art Contest.

In-School Programs: Building on the Festival theme, GHS partnered with the staff of Savannah's Massie Heritage Center to present three programs with hands-on activities focused on developing geographic literacy through analyzing maps and practicing spatial thinking and map skills.

Public Programming for General Audiences: On December 17, 2021, GHS premiered a recorded online program featuring the historian Dr. Andrew Denson in conversation

with the GHS Senior Historian, Dr. Stan Deaton. Focusing on the *Festival* theme of geography, history, and community, this popular program explored Cherokee removal and how Georgians have remembered it. Andrew Denson teaches courses on Native American and United States history and participates in WCU's Cherokee Studies Program. He is the author of *Monuments to Absence: Cherokee Removal and the Contest over Southern Memory*.

Georgia Day Video: Featuring greetings from *Festival* sponsors as well as historical content highlighting communities across the state, a new video for students studying Georgia history has been produced for release on Georgia Day 2022.

General Educational Programs and Resources

Teacher Training and Webinars: GHS education staff presented virtually at two national conferences, including the 2021 National Council for History Education conference in March and the Teaching with Primary Sources Eastern Region Conference in June. GHS education staff also presented to Georgia educators via the National History Day Georgia's teacher training program in July 2021.

Teaching with Primary Sources: In 2021, a proposal developed in a collaborative effort between GHS education staff and historical marker staff was accepted and fully funded by the Library of Congress through the Eastern Region of Teaching with Primary Sources at Waynesburg University. The project was awarded \$20,000 to plan and implement a free teacher training course titled Teaching the Civil Rights Movement with the Georgia Historical Marker Program. During the reporting period, GHS staff worked to design and recruit participants for the online course that begins in January 2022. This is the second TPS Regional Grant awarded to GHS. The first was granted in 2012.

History and Race Initiative: During the reporting period, GHS education staff researched and wrote an Instructional Support and Classroom Strategies for Teaching Challenging Histories Teacher Guide. The guide supports educators as they teach difficult historical topics in the classroom, including but not limited to slavery, racial injustice, and violence. The guide features recommended readings, introduction to the importance of language used when teaching challenging histories, effective classroom strategies for using primary sources to teach challenging histories, and guidance for teachers on how to evaluate their own teaching practices to support teaching challenging histories.

GHS Education COVID 19 Response: Continuing to focus on flexible learning options for students and teachers, GHS staff developed materials for a variety of learning

environments including: at-home learning, remote or online learning, and inperson classrooms. Through the creation of new content, the reorganization and enhancement of existing materials, and thoughtful, targeted promotion of all GHS resources, GHS maintained communication with existing audiences and became a trustworthy source of content for others.

Online Outreach: GHS staff reviewed and updated features on the "For Educators" webpage including all sub-pages. The unique pageviews for all webpages associated with GHS Education and Outreach totaled 465,848 during the reporting period.

GHS Schoolhouse: Educators and students continue to access the fifty educational videos available through the blog and on GHS's YouTube, TeacherTube, and SchoolTube channels. To date, the videos included on GHS Schoolhouse have received 224,413 views across all our platforms. GHS Schoolhouse can be viewed at http:// schoolhouse.georgiahistory.com.

Teacher Webinars: All webinars presented in 2021 were recorded and can continue to be viewed on the GHS YouTube page.

GHS Education Newsletter: Education staff published fourteen monthly GHS Education Newsletters in 2021.

Business History Initiative: GHS education staff published a BHI profile and case-study for the Colonial Group, Inc.

Public Programs

Recognizing an Imperfect Past: A History and Race Initiative: Through this new initiative, the Georgia Historical Society seeks to educate and use the power of our shared history to foster difficult but necessary conversations that will offer all Americans new and deeper perspectives on the past and the present. Participating companies have the opportunity to help their employees, students, and the general public to better understand the role that race has played in shaping Georgia and the United States.

In 2021, GHS began coordinating the programmatic elements of the inaugural History and Race Initiative partnership project with Mercedes-Benz USA (MBUSA), including presentations by Dr. Stan Deaton to MBUSA team members, development of new educational resources, and a new historical marker as part of the Georgia Civil Rights Trail.

The History and Race Initiative also received significant support from a Coca-Cola Foundation grant this year and GHS will continue implementation of this planning grant throughout 2022.

Dooley Distinguished Fellows Program: On April 29, 2021, GHS announced that Tracy Barnett, University of Georgia; Lewis Eliot, University of South Carolina; and Dawn Wiley, University of Alabama, have been named to the inaugural class of Vincent J. Dooley Distinguished Research Fellows at the Georgia Historical Society. GHS looks forward to hosting these scholars at the Research Center in 2022.

Tracy Barnett is a PhD student at the University of Georgia working with the Civil War historian Stephen Berry. She is writing a dissertation on gun ownership in the South from 1850-1877 and will be researching in a number of manuscripts in the GHS Research Center, examining gun ownership and sales, hunting, and westward migration.

Lewis Eliot will graduate with a PhD from the University of South Carolina in May 2021. Mr. Eliot is researching the Africa Squadron of the US Navy that patrolled the

eastern Atlantic Ocean in search of ships illegally transporting enslaved Africans to the Americas. GHS holds numerous collections with material related to Georgians who served in the US and Confederate navies.

Dawn Wiley is a PhD student at the University of Alabama writing a dissertation on Women in the Civil War South. At GHS she will be researching collections containing letters between women on the home front and soldiers serving in the Confederate Army, and other collections that focus on women in antebellum Georgia.

Affiliate Chapter Program: During 2021, GHS hosted four webinars for Affiliate Chapters using Zoom. These webinars were done in conjunction with the 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 Georgia History Festival and covered a series of local history topics.
